The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is administered by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction. The program provides nutritious meals to children during the summer, when free and reduced-priced school meals are unavailable. No need to sign up or apply for this program. Just come and enjoy a tasty and nutritious meal. Meals are provided to eligible children 18 years of age or younger regardless of race, color, national origin, age, gender or disability and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. Persons over 18 years of age who are determined by a state or local public educational agency to be mentally or physically disabled and who also participate in a public or private non-profit school programs during the regular school year may receive free meals as well. Adults are welcome to attend and will be charged a small fee of \$2.50 for breakfast and \$4.00 for lunch. Anyone 19 years or old is considered an adult. All meals must be consumed on site. You cannot pickup meals to take home.

Middle School will be open to the public this summer for breakfast and lunch. Please use door M on the Clark St. side of the building. When entering through door M, breakfast and lunch will be served in the cafeteria, located straight forward into the cafeteria and to the left. We hope to see you during our meal service, have a great summer!
