

RECOMMENDED DRESS FOR GRADUATION

- Males: Dress shirt (white, if possible) and tie
Dark shoes and socks – no sandals
Dark pants or dress pants
No shorts, please
If you are wearing a suit/sports jacket, it is not generally worn under the gown
Well-groomed hair
- Females: A dress, skirt, or dress slacks
Dress shoes or dressy sandals – no tennis shoes or flip flops
Well-groomed hair
White collars will not be used.
- Important: You must have your mortarboard design approved by Mr. Adams. Once you have received approval, you must also show your finished mortarboard to Mr. Adams by May 16th to be able to wear it for graduation. No approval will be given the day of graduation. You will need to purchase a blank cap.
- Mortarboards/
Gowns: The shorter point of the crown should be worn to the front as marked inside the cap.
The mortarboard should sit squarely on your head, not tilted! (Ladies should be sure to bring bobby pins.) When you pick up your order, be sure to check that you have a cap, gown, and tassel. Students choosing to place messages on the mortarboard:
You must have your mortarboard design and final product approved by Mr. Adams by 5/16.
- Tassel: Students should wear the White and Gold 2019 tassel draped over the left side of the cap.
It must be a tassel ordered from Jostens. There are several options when ordering.
After the presentation of the diplomas, the tassel is moved from the left side of the mortarboard to the right side when directed.
- Diploma Jacket: You will receive the diploma jacket with the left hand and receive the handshake with the right. The actual diplomas will be given out in the small gym following the ceremony.
- Rehearsals: We cannot begin until all graduating seniors are present. If you are concerned about the time we will be spending for rehearsal, you can assist in helping to get classmates here on time. Set up phone trees; pick people up, set alarms for habitual over-sleepers; just do what you have to do to get them here!!!

The commencement ceremony should be dignified and respectful. To ensure all graduate's names are heard by family and friends, air horns and other noisemakers are prohibited. Silly String will not be allowed in the gymnasium. Something will be provided to each graduate from Ms. Kaye and Ms. Tupper to celebrate with at the conclusion of the graduation ceremony. The manner in which the ceremony is conducted is a reflection upon the students, your class, your family, your school and the community.
