#### Dear Parents/Guardians:

As we near the middle of the 3rd quarter, we are eager to use the time we have left to help your child make a difference in their learning. Second quarter brought great success for our students with major gains in both ELA and Math. This has a lot to do with good attendance. Being in school all day, every day, helps your child get the most out of school.

Please help your child by encouraging good attendance. Point out there is no substitute for being in class. Your child needs to be present to get direct core instruction from their teacher to explain concepts, participate in group projects, class discussions, and to ask questions. Please try to avoid absences by checking our school calendar before scheduling appointments during school days.

In the upcoming weeks, your child will be participating in the Forward exam, which is our state assessment. Our testing window is from March 18th through April 26th. This assessment ensures that we are providing the instruction needed to make our students successful. An accurate score from each of our students is vital. Sleep is very important during this time. Please set reasonable bedtimes to allow your child to get eight to nine hours of sleep. For the best sleep, please have your child unplug electronically 30 minutes prior while keeping those devices in another room.

The state assessment for 8th grade students will focus in the areas of math, literacy, science and social studies. For 6th and 7th grade students it will focus on literacy and math. Just like any other day, it is very important for your child to be present during testing days. As mentioned above, we ask you to please refrain from making appointments to avoid your child from being absent during this window of opportunity so we may learn what your child has retained. Your child will not be testing in every class during this block of dates. Tests will be spread out during the days and weeks within this window allowing students the ability to have breaks between testing to get a true picture of what they have learned.

The month of March is officially designated as the month of the middle school student. This is the month when we take time to place extra focus on all that comes with being middle school students. As I'm sure many of you can attest to as parents, these tend to be some of the most challenging years for you and your children. These are the years they begin to explore their own way, find out where they fit in with their social group, voices change, physical changes, friends tend to be of the greatest importance to them, and so much more. "I don't know how you do it" is a common phrase I hear often from parents as they comment on how we work with middle school students every day! I have worked in the middle school for 20 years and there is no where else I would rather be. Our students bring excitement, silliness, and joy to our lives every day.

The month of March also brings with it multiple competitions. Our Quiz Bowl and Regional Spelling Bee teams will be competing against area schools. We have some incredible students achieving amazing accomplishments.

This is the time of the year our staff tackles twice the amount of planning. We look to make the rest of this year fantastic while starting to plan for next year. If you have not done so already, please make sure to mark your calendar for next year. Our Fall Rally date has been set for August 14th. Please stay tuned for more important information.

Thank you for all the support you have provided your child through the first half of the year, and we look forward to your ongoing support as we move forward.
